### “Behold...”

- A \_\_\_\_\_ stood in heaven ([4:2a](#))
- \_\_\_\_\_ is seated on this throne ([4:2b-3a](#))
- \_\_\_\_\_ the throne come flashes of lightning and rumblings of thunder ([4:5a](#))
- \_\_\_\_\_ the throne are seven torches of fire and a sea of glass ([4:5b-6a](#))
- Around the throne is:
  - A \_\_\_\_\_ ([4:3b](#))
  - Twenty-four elders seated on twenty-four thrones ([4:4](#))
  - Four living creatures who never stop \_\_\_\_\_ the praise of God ([4:6b-11](#))

### “But who is \_\_\_\_\_ to approach such a throne?” ([5:1-4](#); [Psa 24](#))

- “Behold...”
  - The \_\_\_\_\_ of the tribe of Judah ([5:5a](#); [Gen 49:9-10](#))
  - The \_\_\_\_\_ of David ([5:5b](#); [Isa 11:1-10](#); [Mark 12:35-37](#); [Rev 22:16](#))
  - A \_\_\_\_\_ standing, as though it had been slain ([5:6-7](#))
  - Hundreds of millions of \_\_\_\_\_ ([5:11-12](#))
  - \_\_\_\_\_ itself offering blessing, honor, glory and might ([5:13-14](#))
  - A \_\_\_\_\_ people ([5:9-10](#)) whose \_\_\_\_\_ land before the throne ([5:8](#); [8:1-4](#))
- Let \_\_\_\_\_ then with confidence draw near to this throne of grace ([Heb 4:14-16](#))
