

•	Why do you think Herod Agrippa I would "lay violent hands on some who belonged to the church"?
•	When you think of James the brother of John who was killed by Herod, what comes to your mind? Who was he? What can we know about him? Mark 10:35-45 might also be worth going back and reading together.
>	While Peter was in prison, "earnest prayer for him was made to God by the church" (Acts 12:5). Is there anything we can learn from that?
•	What can we learn about angels from 12:6-11?
>	We're told very little about Mary, the mother of John (whose other name was Mark) in Acts 12, but what can we appreciate about her in 12:12?
>	"But the word of God increased and multiplied" (12:24). What does Luke want us to see, understand, and remember from this account?
•	In 12:25, we read about Barnabas and Saul returning from Jerusalem "when they had completed their service." According to 11:27-30, what was that service?
•	Acts 12 has introduced us to John Mark. According to Colossians 4:10, how was Mark related to Barnabas?
