So what can we learn that will help us in our own walk with Jesus? Let's dig in...

## For Class & Family Discussion:

- 1. Of all the things Jesus could reference in his hometown synagogue that day, he found the place where it was written and read Isaiah 61:1-2. In your own words, what was Jesus communicating when he said, "Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing"?
- 2. Take a careful look at that 700-year-old prophecy. In what way did Jesus fulfill each of these lines? Can you think of specific instances from his life where he fulfilled...
  - "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me"?
  - "He has anointed me"?
  - "To proclaim good news to the poor"?
  - "He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives"?
  - "And recovering of sight to the blind"?
  - "To set at liberty those who are oppressed"?
  - "To proclaim the year of the Lord's favor"?
- 3. Why did he bring up Elijah being sent to the widow in Zarephath from 1 Kings 17?
- 4. Why did he bring up Elisha cleansing Naaman the Syrian from 2 Kings 5?
- 5. Why do you think the people who heard Jesus became filled with wrath?
- 6. So what about us? We want not only to "cross paths" with Jesus, but to walk with him as his disciples. So what should we carry away with us from this episode in his hometown synagogue?
